Malta's representation during ITB in the CULTURE LOUNGE *The island nation presents its comprehensive cultural programme 2019*

After the successful year of 2018, with Valletta being designated European Cultural Capital, Malta responds with its own stand in the ITB Lounge (Hall 16/4) in order to demonstrate that this island still has much to offer towards cultural tourism.

With their natural beauty, the Maltese islands are also distinguished by a long and rich history, retaining traditions down through the centuries which are still celebrated with numerous festivals up to this day.

Preceded by a colourful and boisterous Carnival, the Easter season is rich with religious traditions. Artistic and cultural events comprise a large segment of the festival calendar, with highlights such as the International Fireworks Festival (24th April through 4th May), the Malta Arts Festival (29th June through 13th July), the Jazz Festival (15th – 20th July), and the Notte Bianca Culture Night on 5th October 2019.

The most recent addition to the cultural scene is the new national art museum of Malta, the MUZA, in Valletta. The extensive and substantial exhibition includes audio-visual elements and interactive exhibits. There are over 20,000 displays of contemporary and historical artworks, including the entire collected works of the native Maltese sculptor Antonio Sciortino.

Malta is also present at two additional stands at this year's ITB in Berlin, with the main stand in Hall 1.2/220, and in LGBT Travel Pavilion, Hall 21B.
