Dom Museum Wien

Dom Museum Wien - just next door to St. Stephen's Cathedral - presents 1,000 years of art in a contemporary setting.

The collections of Dom Museum Wien in the heart of Vienna's historic city center are unique: the historic treasures of St. Stephen's Cathedral, avant-garde classics from the legendary Otto Mauer Collection and contemporary art make for an inspiring visit. The contemporary architectural redesign of the historic palace that features Vienna's direct views of Stephen's landmark, St.



Cathedral, allows for an exciting juxtaposition of old and new. Upon entering the museum, with its large glass façade portal, a round glass elevator, encircled by an elegant winding staircase, takes visitors upstairs to the exhibition galleries, where, among other things, the oldest portrait of the Western World awaits: that of Hapsburg ruler Rudolf IV, from the 14th century.

Extraordinary sculptures, precious altars, sacred objects adorned with gold and jewels, portraits, liturgical manuscripts, books, and magnificent vestments ranging from the Gothic to the Art

Deco period are there to be discovered. The surprising twist is the museum's legendary Otto Mauer Collection. which is a large collection of modern and contemporary artworks, by Expressionists and Secessionists and key figures in the Austrian and international avant-garde. The collections are continuously expanded include to contemporary art.



Dom Museum Wien also offers special exhibitions examining the intersection of society, religion, and the arts. Juxtaposing works of art that span a cultural-historical arc from the Middle Ages to the present, the current exhibition "Being Mortal" (on view until August 25, 2024) traces the deep meaning of death in individual as well as collective and socio-political contexts. The exhibition features



paintings, photographs, sculptures, drawings, and videos.

Combined tickets and/or tours are available with St. Stephen's Cathedral, which help contextualize the precious objects shown at Dom Museum Wien with regard to their place of origin, the historic landmark of the city of Vienna. Combined admission for the neighboring Mozarthaus Vienna is also available.

A remote visit to Dom Museum Wien is also possible: A free, interactive App (www.dommuseum. at/app) offers virtual tours of the museum. It is available for Apple and Android devices, in German, English, French, Italian, Spanish, and Russian language versions.


